Why bolt your safe to the floor?

Recently, there have been reports of burglars removing entire safes from homes and businesses. The lesson here is, that given enough time and the right tools, virtually any safe can be compromised. Even something as heavy and reinforced as a vault can be opened. There is a reason that banks install burglar alarms. The alarm detects intrusions and does not allow burglars time to penetrate vaults.

So, our advice, as always, is to bolt your safe to the ground – no matter how heavy. Anchoring your safe down makes it extremely difficult to remove from the premises.

A burglar has more time and access to tools to break in to a safe once it is removed from your home or business. If the safe is anchored, the burglar is working against time. Ask Supreme about concrete anchor bolts or wood floor toggle bolts to securely anchor your safe.

Also, it is worth mentioning that, if you store high-dollar valuables in your safe, you should install a security alarm system in addition to anchoring your safe. Burglars will have less time to attempt a break-in with an alarm system detecting their intrusion and sounding a siren and/or alerting police.

Make sure to select the right type of safe for what you're protecting. The risk of fire is higher than a burglary. Burglar safes are constructed entirely of heavy-gauge steel and will readily transfer intense heat inside the safe. Composite safes offer both fire and burglary protection. These safes are very reasonably priced, but offer different degrees of fire and burglary protection. It is important to research your options to select a safe that best meets your needs.
